What Is CanyonvieW?

Canyonview is a non-profit Christian ministry sponsored by Bible Teaching Inc., and is located on 90 acres of a beautifully wooded canyon along Drift Creek, south of Silverton, Oregon. The Equestrian Center consists of a barn with 38 box stalls, fully enclosed riding arena (80'x200') with viewing area, and an outdoor riding arena (100'x200'). Training Barn has 14 stalls, with paddocks & runs and hay storage. The Ranch Headquarters building houses all of our campers and guests in cabins. It also holds our college dorms as well as the staff program offices, and the dining area.

Canyonview offers year-round programming in various forms for those wanting to learn more about horses and deepen their relationship with God. During the school year, we offer Fellowship Riding lessons, wherein riders come for group riding lessons and a Bible Study once a week. On the weekends, we have camp from Friday night through Sunday afternoon. Some of the camps that we offer are Mother & Daughter, Parent & Child, Junior Camp, and Western Round Up. In the summer, we offer 11 weeks of summer camp for 35 youth per week. Canyonview is also the home of Canyonview Equestrian College where we offer a "Christ-centered education for horsemanship ministry." It is a two-year intensive resident program (maximum of 16 students) training the future leaders of horsemanship ministry. Canyonview maintains a herd of 70 horses to meet the needs of our camping and college ministries.

Past Ride-a-thons have Made a difference at CeC!

Canyonview Equestrian College students have been participating in Ride-A-Thons for the last eight years. Through their diligence and the generous outpouring of support the Lord has made many building projects come to fruition! The original goal was a roundpen. We have Preifert round pens! The next major goal was to build and finish the CEC Training Center that is a 100x125 clear span arena. This allows our students a dedicated place to ride when programs are occupying the main indoor arena. This Training Center includes office space for three of our faculty, a resource room, classroom, two dorm rooms and two restrooms that include showers. Last year the project was finishing the Training Barn that included 14 stalls and hay storage.

What Canyonview Means to Me

I am a college student here at CEC and I am learning more about the Lord, how to study His Word and how to apply it as I am involved in our weekend camps and Fellowship Riding Lessons. I am also expanding my knowledge regarding safe, fun, and effective horsemanship. What Is the need?

The existing stall fronts have been in constant use since 1976 and are falling apart fast, with need of yearly painting and are unsightly. We believe fixing them without changing and improving them would not be

wise stewardship of time and money.

A couple of the reasons why we want to improve the stall fronts:

- ◆ Old stall doors open on the wrong side
- ◆ Door openings are too small for saddled horses. Saddles get scraped or hung up on chains
- ◆ Use of chains allow horses to lean into hall and socialize too much
- ◆ Horses can put their heads over top of grill
